Johnson Family House Fire

On January 31st we learned about a family that was the victim of an unfortunate house fire. The fire occurred in the early morning hours of Jan 28th and started in the parent's bedroom. Although the fire was contained to the bedroom and quickly put out by responding Tulsa Fire Department personnel, one adult was injured and sustained first and second degree burns. Thankfully, the three children who were in the residence at the time escaped without injury.

Our initial response was to purchase them a new cell phone so they could communicate with their friends and family. We later went to the house with a team of offduty police officers and church members to survey the damage and help with cleanup. We quickly learned that smoke damage had rendered everything in the house a total loss, including the walls and ceiling. Through hard work and teamwork, we were able to get most of the debris out, as well as demo all the sheetrock that had smoke damage. This family continues to need our love and support, as they are currently homeless and looking for options /finances to rebuild their family home.

On Wednesday February 20th, we learned about more bad news with this family: The father Eric was hospitalized with blood poising, most likely from breathing in soot working on the house.
